It has come a long way from a 33 students in 2007 to a current strength of 350 students. There are 09 accomplished faculty members supported by a team of hardworking and efficient non-teaching staff. The preparation of this self-study report of the college has been given an in depth insight in to the strength and weaknesses of our evening college.

For better learning outcome our college got ISO 9001: 2015 for quality management system. It helps us to provide a common management system to improve our processes and address the needs and expectations of our students.
- 5. We got ISO 14004:2015 certification for an environmental management system. It helped us to manage our environmental responsibilities in a systematic manner that contributes to the environmental pillar of sustainability.
- 6. K G College got Green Compliance certificate for Green Audit in its k g campus.

Institutional Weakness

- 1. Financial burden of the college has been increasing because all the academic programs are on self-financing mode and most of the students are from below poverty line. Though students are getting social welfare scholarships, but it's difficult to manage salaries.
- 2. The Covid- 19 Pandemic has resulted in massive income issues for many households. Students from privileged background migrated to their native place to find their bread and butter. In poor households, these declines inhousehold income resulted to reduce their investin education.
- 3. Declining student's strength especially in the B A and BBA (CA) and due to pandemic situation also.
- 4. Due to Non grant and evening college status, qualified and committed teachers are not ready to join college and shouldered the responsibilities. Principal and Librarian posts are still vacant. Two times in the year we published advertisements but nobody turned.
- 5. Due to vacant Principal post we are not able to take any research project .College has to abide by the regulations of the University which limits infrastural and faculty development. The college needs to enrich the research base and explore the capacities among the faculties and students.

Curricular Aspects

The vision, mission and objectives of K G College of Arts and Commerce is amply reflected in the college's motto "Improving Lives, Through Learning" Right from its inception in 2007 till today, our college has proven to achieve greater heights in quality education. K G College is committed to raising level of education and helping disadvantaged students realize their full potential. K G College seeks to ensure quality education for poor and rural children's, opening the door for them to participate in and benefit from India's economic growth. K G College use innovative method for the overall development and blooming of each student. The college empower student to meet future challenges. K G College imparts quality education keeping in mind its vision and mission of creating individuals with academic and emotional excellence. The College offers B A, B Com, and BBA (CA) courses .As our college is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University and the syllabi of graduation classes is designed by the university, however, the syllabi of short term courses is designed by the concerned departments with consultation of experts. The faculty works to words encouraging an attitude of enquiry, a critical outlook and an analytical approach among the students. At the beginning of every academic year teaching plan is prepared by the faculty .Attempt is made to integrate issues relevant to gender, environment and sustainability, human values and professional ethics in to the curriculum. Feedback on curriculum from all the stakeholders is obtained, analyzed and action taken is available on the college website. The committees like the grievance cell, SC/ST/OBC, counseling Committee and Women Development Cell have been created to address the special needs of the students.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Admissions in our K G College are made on the guidelines of Maharashtra State and Savitribai Phule Pune University. The college follows a policy of giving concession to poor Students. The University guidelines are strictly followed through the admissions with regard to minimum criteria for admissions to different courses. K G College has created facilities for differently able students in accordance with government guidelines. Differently able students not only get equal opportunities to acquire knowledge, but also extra support to achieve their goals.

Creative teaching and learning system is implemented in the college. The faculty members apply discussion method and subject specific learning strategies that optimize learning outcomes .Apart from teaching participatory methods such as role play, guest lectures, group discussion, and assignments, incorporated to render the process learner- centric. Guest faculties drawn from the industry are invited to give expert lectures.

To identify slow learners college conducts the test of the first year students after admission and on that basis various activities are conducted by each department are organized. Department holds a meeting of students along with faculty to conduct at least six activities to be organized during the academic year.

Qualified and competent faculty is recruited. Regular discussion is conducted to ensure professional development and maintains of standards. Teachers excellence is also enhance by a structural feedback system . Teacher use them for improving their performance.

Continuous evolution is adopted in the evolution of students. The internal assessment include internal test, participation, seminars, assignments and extracurricular and co-curricular activities for student assessment.

Research, Innovations and Extension

In the last five years 1 staff member has completed doctoral studies, 2 staff members have registered for PhD and are working on their doctoral thesis. Special consideration is given in the time table for the faculty members who are involved in research activity.
